## **2. Causes of Marital Homicide**

- **Sudden Provocation:** Instances of grave and sudden provocation are often cited; emotional triggers may drive spouses to commit homicide in the heat of moment.
- **Domestic Violence:** Persistent abuse, harassment, and control issues—notably linked to dowry demands—underlie many such cases.
- **Extramarital Affairs:** A large proportion of killings involve extramarital collusion; in some cases, spouses enlist accomplices for contract killings or premeditated murder.
- **Mental and Physical Cruelty:** The evolution of cruelty as grounds for separation reflects growing recognition of psychological torment in marriages, which sometimes contributes to fatal outcomes.

## **3. Legal Analysis**

- **Gender-Biased Laws:** There exist systemic gaps in Indian law, with dominant focus on female victimization and under-recognition of male grievances.
- **Underreporting and Investigative Bias:** NCRB data does not specifically categorize spouse homicide, leading to serious underreporting and lack of targeted intervention.

- Dowry Deaths: India records thousands of dowry deaths annually, predominantly involving the bride as victim at the hands of the husband's family, but emerging data suggests husbands are increasingly at risk too.
- Calls for Reform: Experts argue for gender-neutral domestic violence statutes and improved forensic protocols to address and prevent marital homicide.

#### **4. Psychological Factors**

Studies correlate marital discord—divorce, unresolved conflict, and separation—with increased risk of serious violence, including homicide. The mental stress associated with failed relationships, particularly when coupled with societal stigma and lack of support systems, exacerbates the risk

#### **5. Data and Trends**

- Estimated 270–300 annual cases of husband murder by wives in India between 2022–2025 (one every 32 hours), mostly linked to extramarital affairs and severe provocation. Poisoning (40%), strangulation (25%), and contract killing (15%) are among the prevalent methods.
- In 2011, over 8,300 dowry deaths were reported—bride burning, poisoning, and hanging being common methods.
- NCRB 2022 survey notes about 1.7 lakh suicides, with approx. 50% linked to marital issues, and an almost equal male-to-female ratio.

Such killings are often the culmination of chronic dysfunction, failed legal interventions, and societal pressures. The fallout includes psychological trauma for family members, particularly children, and erodes trust in the institution of marriage. The lack of holistic conflict resolution mechanisms and gender-neutral support systems exacerbate the crisis.
