He was born at home, assisted only by a midwife, for his mother, owing to prevailing orthodoxy and family restrictions, was denied the opportunity of availing the facilities of a hospital. His father, Abanibhushan Mitra, was a primary school teacher and his mother, Sandhyarani Mitra, was a housewife. This deprivation left a mark on his early life, as he remained frail and unable to stand on his own feet during his infancy. A turning point came when his grandmother was treated by the renowned physician Dr Sauren Banerjee from Kolkata, situated nearly sixty kilometers from their home. In 1969, the doctor's visit cost the family an extraordinary sum of Rs. 3000, with an additional Rs. 400 paid separately for his father's consultation. On Dr Banerjee's advice, young Biman Mitra, then barely one and a half years old, was admitted to the newly established BC Roy Polyclinic Hospital at Beleghata—an institution founded within the residence of Dr Bidhan Chandra Roy himself. In that 26-bed facility, still in its earliest phase of inception, he became the very first successful patient. What began as a desperate attempt at survival stretched into a long six years of hospital life, during which his fragile childhood matured amid medical supervision.

At the age of seven and a half, when he finally returned home, his parents enrolled him in the village primary school. By then, his early foundation in learning had been so rigorous that he was directly admitted to class III. From that time onward, his parents instilled in him an unwavering conviction: that only through education could he secure a dignified future and shield himself from the hardships of want. Every morning his mother would wake him, and alongside his only elder brother, he would begin his lessons.
