# History of Yanam Assembly Constituency from 1954 to 2021

#### Abstract-

The Yanam Assembly Constituency, an enclave of the Union Territory of Puducherry located geographically within Andhra Pradesh, has undergone a significant political and demographic transformation from the de facto transfer of French territories in 1954 to the 2021 legislative elections. As part of the Puducherry Lok Sabha Parliamentary Constituency, Yanam occupies a unique administrative position shaped by its territorial discontinuity, linguistic identity, and historical governance structures. This study examines the evolution of Yanam's electoral behaviour, demographic patterns, administrative extent, village structure, and legislative representation by integrating census records, electoral data, cartographic analysis, and historical documentation. The research also presents statistical charts, maps, and a complete MLA chronology to illustrate changing patterns of development and political participation. Through a comprehensive historical and empirical approach, the paper contributes to a deeper understanding of Yanam's socio-political identity and its distinctive role within the broader framework of Puducherry's governance and India's federal democratic system.

#### 1. Introduction

The Yanam Assembly Constituency, located within the Union Territory of Puducherry but geographically surrounded by Andhra Pradesh, represents a rare administrative and political phenomenon in India. Its evolution from a former French enclave into a vibrant democratic constituency reflects a complex interplay of cultural identity, electoral participation, and territorial discontinuity. Yanam forms an integral part of the **Puducherry Lok Sabha Parliamentary Constituency**, thereby linking its small electorate with the wider political dynamics of the Union Territory.

Following the de facto transfer of French settlements on 1 November 1954, Yanam underwent administrative restructuring and gradual integration into India's constitutional framework.<sup>3</sup> The period between 1954 and 2021 provides a well-defined historical arc through which demographic change, electoral behaviour, constituency boundaries, and patterns of political representation can be examined.<sup>4</sup> The present study addresses the administrative extent of Yanam, its population trends, voter distribution, village structure, electoral performance, and the list of MLAs who represented the constituency. It also incorporates cartographic evidence, census data, and electoral charts to present a holistic account of






#### 2. Geographical Location and Administrative Extent

Yanam covers **30 sq. km** and is situated along the Gauthami–Godavari river channel near the Bay of Bengal.<sup>7</sup> Despite its small size, Yanam's coastal position historically facilitated riverine navigation, maritime activities, and cultural linkages along the Coromandel Coast.<sup>8</sup>

Administratively, Yanam includes **six revenue villages**—Yanam, Agraharam, Mettakur, Kanakalapeta, Farampeta, and Adavipolam—each contributing to the municipality's socio-economic composition. Unlike its neighbouring districts in Andhra Pradesh, Yanam does **not have Mandals**, because Puducherry employs a commune–municipality administrative structure inherited partly from French governance. The municipal area comprises **10 wards**, governed by the Yanam Municipality, which oversees civic services, planning, sanitation, and local administration. Additional reports show that recent redemarcation efforts were partly influenced by urban expansion and population density changes. The combination of enclave geography and Puducherry's administrative framework gives Yanam a distinct institutional identity within India's federal system.



#### 3. Demographic Characteristics (Census 2011 and Trends)

According to the Census of India 2011, Yanam recorded a population of 55,626, with 27,301 males and 28,325 females, resulting in a sex ratio of 1,038 females per 1,000 males—significantly above the national average.<sup>14</sup>

Yanam is a 100% urban constituency, with its population concentrated in dense clusters across the municipality.<sup>15</sup> Educational indicators show a literacy rate of 80.26%, reflecting relatively high socioeconomic development.<sup>16</sup>

Yanam is nationally recognized for its **exceptionally high voter turnout**, regularly exceeding **90%** in Assembly elections. <sup>19</sup> This reflects a politically engaged electorate and strong community mobilization.





Studies note that Yanam's compact settlement pattern reduces geographic barriers to voting, facilitating near-universal turnout across multiple election cycles.<sup>20</sup> The constituency's small territorial size, dense urban clustering, and close proximity of polling stations enable voters to access electoral facilities with minimal travel time, creating an environment that structurally supports exceptionally high participation rates. Unlike larger rural constituencies where geographic dispersion, transportation constraints, or socioeconomic disparities may suppress electoral activity, Yanam's urban morphology ensures that almost every household remains within easy reach of polling infrastructure. This physical ease of access, coupled with effective voter list management and booth-level mobilization, contributes substantially to turnout percentages that frequently exceed 90–95%, among the highest in India.

Electoral scholars observe that Yanam is one of the few constituencies in India where Independent candidates have repeatedly secured victories across multiple decades, demonstrating that electoral success in this region is driven far more by personal credibility, localized leadership networks, and direct community engagement than by formal party alignment.<sup>23</sup> Unlike most constituencies where party affiliation, ideological positioning, or statewide political waves significantly influence outcomes, Yanam's electoral behavior highlights a distinct pattern of personalized politics, in which voters prioritize leaders who exhibit long-standing familiarity with local issues, accessibility to the public, and an ability to navigate the unique administrative complexities arising from Yanam's status as a Puducherry enclave within Andhra Pradesh. This has resulted in a political culture where charismatic independent leaders—often backed by strong kinship, neighbourhood, and occupational associations—are perceived as more capable of delivering tangible constituency development than party-based candidates whose priorities may be shaped by broader territorial or partisan agendas. Consequently, Yanam stands as a compelling case within Indian electoral studies, illustrating how micro-level sociopolitical dynamics can override conventional party structures and produce a sustained tradition of independent legislative representation.

## 6. Socio-Political Dynamics and Administrative Identity

Yanam's socio-political character is profoundly shaped by its Telugu-speaking cultural identity, its coastal economic base, and its unique administrative status as an enclave of the Puducherry Union Territory located within Andhra Pradesh.<sup>24</sup> These intertwined elements create a governance environment in which linguistic affiliation, regional economic linkages, and institutional history intersect to influence political attitudes and electoral behaviour. The constituency's development priorities often revolve around coastal protection projects, improvement of municipal services, expansion of

educational institutions, healthcare access, and the creation of local employment opportunities, reflecting the needs of a densely populated urban enclave whose residents depend heavily on both riverine and coastal ecosystems.<sup>25</sup>

Recent administrative assessments emphasize Yanam's increasing integration with the **regional urban system of Kakinada, Yanam's nearest metropolitan centre**, as well as its economic interactions with the broader **Godavari delta region**, which has contributed to improved mobility, expanded commercial activity, and infrastructural modernization.<sup>26</sup> Enhanced connectivity has facilitated greater interdependence in areas such as markets, transportation, education, fisheries, and labour mobility. These developments have gradually reshaped Yanam into a **hybrid urban space** that reflects both Puducherry's administrative frameworks and Andhra Pradesh's socio-economic rhythms.

At the same time, socio-cultural studies highlight that despite decades of Indian administration, Indo-French cultural legacies remain distinctly visible in Yanam's urban landscape.<sup>27</sup> The presence of French-style colonial architecture, street names, municipal administrative conventions, educational traditions, and certain civic rituals underscores the long historical association with French rule. These cultural elements contribute to a dual-layered identity, wherein residents simultaneously identify with the Telugu cultural sphere and with the institutional and historical continuity of the former French territories.

This complex blend of **linguistic**, **administrative**, **economic**, **and historical layers** produces a political environment that is highly localized yet deeply shaped by cross-regional dynamics. Yanam's electorate prioritizes leaders who can navigate this blend effectively—championing local development needs while managing administrative relations between Puducherry and neighbouring Andhra Pradesh. The constituency therefore exemplifies how small enclaves can develop **distinct socio-political ecosystems**, shaped by geography, history, cultural hybridity, and the administrative specificities of Union Territory governance.
